I am writing in response to your questionnaire. Thank you for taking the time to inquire about my opinions on issues of concern to your members. The issues brought up in your questionnaire require careful consideration; I thought it better to address them in more detail than to check off yes-or-no responses. I hope that this response will prove useful to you.

1. Support with qualifications. I argued in favor of Arizona's school tax credits (Hibbs v. Wynn) before the United States Supreme Court. However, I believe that the current tax credit system should be modified to prevent those taking the credits designating who will receive them beneficiaries should be economically disadvantaged. Under current case law, vouchers present constitutional challenges when used for religious schools.
2. Oppose with qualifications. Whenever possible, I favor using non embryo cells for medical procedures. It is my understanding that most, if not all, of the procedures which previously used embryonic stem cells can now be conducted without them. To be clear, embryo cells should not be used if non embryo cells provide a medically viable alternative.
3. Oppose.
4. Oppose. The Children are not at fault and should not be victimized.
5. Oppose. The matricula cards perform a valid purpose for many and are not valid for immigration purposes.
6. Oppose. The Arizona law and Constitution contain this provision. The amendments to the US Constitution all involve restrictions on state powers, not on individuals. Changing this constitutional principal to restrict individual rights could have serious adverse consequences for our democracy.
7. Support. However, abortion procedures with government funds are not allowed under Arizona or federal law.
8. Support. As Attorney General, I helped to establish this office and participate in the 'innocence project' in our state as well as setting up a unique enhanced post conviction review which utilizes new forensic methods to find and resolve any wrongful convictions.
9. Support with qualifications. As the legal representative of the State of Arizona, I am defending the authority of the Arizona Legislature to pass a law with these provisions as not barred by our Constitution. However, I urged the Governor to veto SB 1070 because I believe the provisions are

not in the best interest of Arizona, they will be no help in the fight against serious border crimes and ending the cartel menace, they divert important law enforcement resources from investigating and arresting more serious criminals and they harm the delicate relationship between the police and the community known as Community Team Policing. As an alternative to deal with the large numbers of illegal immigrants living in this country because of the decades of inaction by the federal government, I support Comprehensive Immigration Reform with a coincident crackdown on employers of illegal immigrants and a requirement that all illegal immigrants register with the federal government, pass a criminal background check, pay a fine, settle any back taxes, be able to speak English and go to the back of the line if they wish to apply for citizenship.

10. Undecided. I support the public's access to pharmaceuticals, subject to law. As a public health care provider, a clinic has the responsibility to protect the health of a woman seeking medical treatment and make her aware of the options legally available to her. If that is what is meant by "facilitate" the distribution, then I support the proposition. If "facilitate" involved an advocacy of a particular drug, without regard to its health benefits, I do not support it.
